

- A member of the judiciary serves on the Delaware State Bar Association's ("DSBA") Executive Committee which allows for the free flow of information from the Bench to the Bar and vice versa.
- Periodic meetings are held between the Chief Justice of the Delaware Supreme Court and the DSBA President and President-Elect.
- The Delaware Courts often request, via the DSBA, the Bar's opinions on various issues such as rule changes, etc.
- The Bench and the Bar have partnered on a number of projects of common interest including assistance for impaired lawyers, and judicial efforts to encourage the Bar to help lawyers before they reach the disciplinary system.
- Delaware Courts have a tradition of inviting DSBA leaders to speak at Court events such as new lawyer admittee ceremonies and judicial investitures.
- The Courts are sensitive to attending and participating in a variety of DSBA events by reducing Court schedules and encouraging, or sometimes even requiring, judges to attend.
- The Supreme Court has generously allocated funds for different DSBA projects over the years, such as launching the Delaware Law Review, publishing several books, and paying for DELAP program.
- The DSBA regularly assists the Courts by providing staff time and expertise for various projects whether occasional or ongoing. Examples: the dinner for Judge Roth, the judges' portraits, and the lawyer database.
- The judges from all Courts are approachable to members of the Bar and especially to the DSBA leadership, and even to DSBA staff.
